## From the Rector

As you read this, a New Year will have begun. We will all have hopes and expectations: for ourselves, our families, our children. We will hope that the world will be a better, happier place. Perhaps it will, perhaps it will not!

But we live in a world full of division: divided communities, divided countries, divided personal relationships. One of the biggest scandals for Christians is a divided Church, and each year Christians of all traditions observe the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity from Jan 18th to 25th.

The choice of dates is not random: it runs from the Confession of Peter to the Conversion of Paul. Unity is not uniformity. Every healthy society must be open to debate and accommodate within itself diversity of opinion. We will not attain Christian unity overnight after a thousand years, but we can resolve together to work together to bring together Christians in common worship and witness.

Each year we hold a service in the area on the Wednesday of the week. This year the preacher is the Dean of St Patrick's, Very Rev Victor Stacey and the venue St Sylvester's RC Church. Please come along and lend your support to our common witness and help build further the relationships between the Churches in the area and continue the example we in Malahide and Portmarnock have set to others over the years of Christians working together for God's kingdom.

Gravely ill, he had attended the Eucharist in St Andrew's less than two weeks before his death. His deep faith was shown in many practical ways, in his involvement with many organisations which helped others, his deep love for family and friends, his positive unflappability in the face of adversity, and in his regular attendance at St Andrew's. All were based on his faith in Christ, and the recognition of that faith and his deep integrity in business and private life were shown in the huge throng who filled church and chapel, and poured out into the churchyard and entrance.

We offer our love and sympathy to his wife Avril and his children Jennifer, Graham and Deborah and his grandchildren, and to his brother Des (St Margaret's Park) and his family in their deep loss.

Dec 7th, in St Andrew's Churchyard, **Maurice Bishop**, 54 Corr Castle, Sutton. Maurice was one of many ex-RAF pilots who came to Ireland after the Second World War to fly for Aer Lingus. He attended the Presbyterian Church but had in latter years moved to Howth and attended St Mary's Church. This is revised at the February meeting of the Select Vestry. Registration forms are available from the Rector or the Churchwardens and all adult members of the congregation should be registered. It gives the privilege of being eligible to serve on the Select Vestry, at Diocesan Synod or elected as Parochial Nominators in the case of a vacancy arising. Vestrypersons can be 'Resident' (i.e. living within the parish boundary) or 'Accustomed' (i.e. living outside the boundary but attending and subscribing to parish funds). Revision of 'accustomed members' will be a major part of the annual revision.

Trevor has seen St Andrew's through many developments in over forty years at the helm, the last extension having been completed as late as October. Some communities would have declared him a national protected institution (or something similar) for his utter dedication to the education of our children which has always gone far beyond the call of duty, and we hope that he will be able to return to work at some time in the not too far distant future.

We are fortunate in that our Vice-Principal, Lesley McElhinney, has risen magnificently to the challenge and St Andrew's is in good hands. Within 24hrs the services of Ms Amy Sherlock as class substitute for Lesley were sanctioned and she has proved to be an excellent choice.

Our parish secretary and current churchwarden in St Andrew's was taken ill at the Mother's Union meeting on 12th December, and as we go to press is still in hospital. We wish her a full recovery, and the Rector wishes to thank all those who have volunteered to assist in making everything run smoothly while she is 'out of action'
