From the Rector

This will reach you as a new year begins, with all its hopes and aspirations. For us and all Christians, our hopes should be for a better world. For many in our world, last year was a dreadful one, for the victims of civil wars and of religious extremists, for others in this part of the world a continued struggle in the face of financial austerity.

While I do not agree with those who are fomenting disorder in our society for their own ends, it does not surprise me that many do their bidding by joining in protest marches without seeing that there is often another agenda which can promise us even less than we have.

It is necessary that Christians begin with an understanding of our own faith, as Christians and as Anglican Christians. This year, I am setting aside Wednesday evenings as a time when we can think on these things so that we can be more effective as witnesses to what God wants of his world.

On the 7th, 14th and 28th, I will begin with evenings dedicated to the Lambeth Quadrilateral, the four pillars of Anglicanism: Scriptures, Creeds, Sacraments and Order. (The 21st is when we host the local service for the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity) The 4th theme will be on Feb 18th, Ash Wednesday. These evenings are not to stress denominational differences but rather to help us understand how the Anglican tradition of Reformed Catholicism can enrich the thinking of all Christians.

From then until Easter we will join in the Ecumenical meetings which have been so much a part of our life each Lent.

IDEAS FORUM ——— An Update

At the 2014 Easter Vestry meeting, parishioners requested an opportunity to air views. As a result, the Select Vestry set up an Ideas Forum Committee to seek views and suggestions from Parishioners.

Thirty people attended a forum on 23th October. In addition, 21 written submissions were received, hence circa 10% of total households in the parish gave an input.

Views and suggestions were sought and received under the following headings: Worship; Youth; Social; Buildings; Other, including Ecumenical; Parish Mirror; Volunteering; Charitable Giving.

Parishioners clearly stated --- **We need to have services, programmes and activities that our people want to be involved in now and into the future.**

People want us to communicate well, increase awareness, enable people to express their spirituality and care for our society - all in a welcoming way.

Concern was expressed as to where our parish is going.

People want our parish to survive and grow.

Very constructive ideas and suggestions were identified under all headings.

The findings of the Ideas Forum were presented to the Select Vestry at the December meeting. It was agreed to address the various items over the coming months.

Parish Mirror ——— Changes for 2015

The Parish Mirror in its present format has been published bi-monthly since Dec 2010. Over the four-year period, we have endeavoured to bring you current information on significant events and happenings in our parish life, with news items interspersed with photographs.

The advertising revenue, which contributes to subsidising the cost of printing has been declining through the period, consequently the nett cost to the parish of producing the publication has been increasing. Christian Burial

1st November, in Shillelagh Churchyard **Robert Turner**, 45 Seamount Park, Malahide

Robert Turner was vergers and sexton in St Andrew's for 58 years, a remarkable record. He kept the Churchyard in impeccable order, carried out his duties with great dignity and faithfulness, rarely missing a service. Until very recently, he was still playing table tennis, a sport he loved and excelled at, for many years representing Ireland at international level: in earlier years he had also been a cricketer, and was also an expert on horse-racing. His rural background also gave him a great love of the land and he specialised in potatoes, growing a large variety at his family home at Shillelagh, at the back of Church Cottage and on moving to Seamount, at the side of the Churchyard in Malahide, and delighted in presenting some of his produce as a kind of 'first-fruits' offering. When a certain resident in the village maintained a cow, Robert would be seen pushing a handcart of hay from the Churchyard as a gift for the cow!

He only really retired two days before his death when he told the Rector he didn't think he could mark out another grave. He worked to the end and will be sorely missed for his faithfulness. He was a weekly communicant and while obviously getting weaker in the last few months, would accept no help coming up for communion, until the last time, just ten days before his death when he accepted a helping arm. Robert was a man of deep spiritual devotion and a wonderful example for many.

He will be sorely missed. He was laid to rest in Shillelagh in the family grave after a service in St Andrew's conducted by the Rector, and another in Shillelagh Church which always remained so dear to him. May God have mercy on his soul.

We offer our love and sympathy to his wife, Molly his daughters Eleanor (Swords) and Laura (Malahide) and his sons Robert (Germany) and John (Shillelagh) in their great loss at his passing.

- To **consider suggestions** made regarding **buildings and graveyards** and request the Parish Centre Committee and Glebe Wardens for their responses in these matters.
- To **update the list of charitable giving** on the Parish website. *Parishioners are invited to suggest other charities.*
- To **consider suggestions** regarding the **Parish Mirror**, to be dealt with by the editorial committee.
- To further develop the **Ecumenical Group**.
- To **advise parishioners** by email when we have bereavements in the Parish.
