Holidays

Many of us go abroad on holidays over the summer months, and sadly attendance at church is often given a holiday too! We may not know the local language, but right across Europe the Diocese of Europe has chaplaincies both in the big cities such as Paris, Madrid or Vienna, and also in most tourist centres: in all there are 247 Anglican churches in Continental Europe, all of which are delighted to welcome visitors to join their often small but very loyal core congregations. To find out where they are, google 'Diocese of Europe' and be surprised when you find that there is probably a church near where you intend to stay!

Some of our parishioners regularly attend these churches while on holiday and have built up links which encourage both themselves and the local Anglican communities. In Spain and Portugal, there are also indigenous Anglican churches which especially love to meet visitors from Ireland as they were founded by Church of Ireland bishops in 1885 and see us as their Mother Church and are well worth a visit if you are in the larger cities: google Lusitanian Church of Portugal or Spanish Reformed Episcopal Church and see if there is one near you!

Anglicans are also in full communion with Scandinavian and Baltic Lutheran Churches, and with the Old Catholics of Northern and Central Europe, although these are less popular summer destinations!

Going to the local Church when abroad helps us to realise the great variety of Christian experience, yet we are all called to share in one and the same task, of sharing God and his love and the message of reconciliation.

She has also obtained postgraduate qualifications in primary school language teaching and in educational leadership.

While she cannot match Trevor's length of service as Principal, we hope that she will be able to match or even exceed his length of service in the school. St Andrew's School is an essential part of the Parish's witness and outreach and we offer Lesley our support in her new and very responsible task.

St Doulagh's Church

St Doulagh's is the oldest church in Ireland still in regular weekly use. Part of the building dates from the 12th century and is built in an old Irish style with a stone roof: by this time the site had Christian associations dating back to the sixth century when Doulagh settled here, probably as a hermit, and traces of open air baptismal sites still exist, having been turned into holy wells in medieval times.

About 1140, it became a grange (monastic farm) associated with Christ Church Cathedral, which retained the right of nominating the perpetual curate until disestablishment in 1870. The chapel of the community still exists and is now used as the sacristy. As well as the facts, legends sprung up and entered local folklore, such as the story of the low down window in the sacristy as a cure for arthritis, or the room behind the chapel as a hermit's cell.

During the summer months, tours are organised on Sunday afternoons by the Friends of St Doulagh's and donations from this activity contribute a very considerable sum to the upkeep of St Doulagh's. Come along any Sunday afternoon, or encourage your friends and neighbours to come along, and make an outing

to St Doulagh's and be captivated by this historic site encompassing over 1400 years of Fingal's rich history.

Ministry of Healing

The 6.30pm service on the 3rd Sunday of a month is devoted to the Healing Ministry of the Church, and opportunity is given to receive the laying-on of hands during the service, or counselling afterwards. All are welcome to this service, and our thanks to Kelly Fogarty and David Rea for their assistance in the conduct of the service.

Confirmation

Confirmation will take place in spring 2015, and classes will begin early in October after the 6.30pm service in St Marnock's Chapel. Candidates must be 14 years of age by approximately the date of confirmation, which was early April this year. Further details in the next issue of the Mirror.

Churches and grounds

Many visitors and passers-by comment on how well kept the grounds and interiors of our churches are. Thanks are due to Rory Delaney who maintains the Churchyard at St Andrew's, while our Hon. Verger, Robert Turner, still keeps an eagle eye open for things that are not quite as they should be, and brings it to attention! Similarly at St. Doulagh's, Tom Delaney looks after grass maintenance, volunteer work parties ensure that the churchyard is kept in good condition, while Fingal Co. Council keeps St. Doulagh's Field mowed. Our glebewardens, Andy Bailey and Ian Watkins, are keeping an active eye out for anything amiss, and make sure it is put right at the minimum cost to the parish finds. There are also a number of parishioners who keep the brasses polished and are always prepared to help out in many ways. We thank also those who arrange the flowers in the churches under the watchful eye of Norma Sherwood in St Andrew's and Amanda Park in St Doulagh's. Thanks are owed to all for their hard work, carried out so faithfully.
