From the Rector

The Church is people; the buildings where we meet are called 'Churches' because they are the meeting place for the Church. Nor should we see the Church as an institution. You and I are the Church of Christ, and we are called to make that a reality where we are.

Anglicanism, while preserving much of the old Church's structures at the Reformation, has always encouraged the involvement of individual Christians in the life of the local Church. The English position of Churchwarden and of Patron became the stepping off point for greater and greater lay involvement. Schools and charitable works were lay led. In the 19th century in Ireland, the Select Vestry became the instrument of local lay involvement, and at a wider level Synods of clergy and laity together took on responsibility for Church government. Across the water in the 20th century, Parish Councils took on the same role and a General Synod was founded in the 1970s.

The Church is people, and at the end of this month we have a wonderful opportunity to make something of this when we hold our annual Easter Vestry. This is our AGM, when we all have the opportunity to gather and approve our financial accounts, and to elect those who will serve us as parochial wardens and vestry-persons for the coming year.

This year, the Select Vestry has reverted to a mid-week date, on Wednesday 30th March. I hope that there will be a good attendance, and to welcome new faces to the Select Vestry.



Parish Finances—Draft Summary 2015


Total Income €223 k

Lent in Malahide

Our annual Ecumenical Lent talks in the local churches will be well under way by the time you receive this. Each evening begins at 8pm with a short act of worship reflecting the host church's tradition worship style, followed by a talk, plenty of time for questions and answers and then refreshments and fellowship.

On the 8th March, Br. Kevin Crowley will be speaking about his work in the inner city, in St Nicholas of Myra RC Church, in Kinsealy.

The concluding speaker on 17th March will be Rev Earl Storey, one-time Chaplain of Crinken and former Director of the Hard Gospel Project and involved for many years in reconciliation and mediation work in Northern Ireland. This will be held in the chapel of the Carmelite Community in Seapark, Malahide. For anyone thinking of coming, to get to Seapark Convent, go right along the Coast Road, enter Seapark Estate and then left at the top of the entrance road, right to to the top of the hill, and the convent gate is on the left.

Mothering Sunday

This year, Mothering Sunday is on March 6th at the 11.30 am service in St Andrew's and the preacher is Mrs Addy Patterson, a parishioner who is Diocesan Reader in our neighbouring parish of Swords and Donabate.

HOLY WEEK AND EASTER

This is the central time of Christian observance. The events from Palm Sunday to Easter Day are the very foundation of our hopes and our faith, that God in Jesus offered himself in one complete and all sufficient sacrifice to rebuild for ever the relationship between God and humanity. The pilgrimage of Holy Week which begins on Palm Sunday brings us to the side of Jesus as we re-trace the last days of his earthly life and prayerfully try to understand the significance. This year, the theme of our thoughts evening by evening at 8pm in St Andrew's will be 'The Cross as Sign', as 'Pilgrimage' (Monday), 'Failure', (Tuesday) 'Reconciliation' (Wednesday) 'Sacrament'

(Thursday), 'Victory' (Good Friday).

There will also be an 'All Age' service in St Doulagh's at 10.00 am on Good Friday, and at 2pm in St Andrew's. The former is a stations of the cross (weather permitting) using the church grounds for simple readings and prayers, the latter an hour of prayerful reflection in readings, song and prayer marking the very hour at which Jesus died.

On Easter Day, we celebrate the Resurrection as we come to the tomb and try to understand the joy of the disciples when we realise that 'Christ is risen'. Services in St Andrew's will be at 8.00 am, 11.30 am, (An All Age Eucharist) and at 6.30 pm, and in St Doulagh's at 6.00 am and 10.00 am. The first of these services takes place in the gloom of early dawn, emerging into a world alight with light which seems to be rejoicing that Christ's risen power illuminates the world.

Easter Vestry

The Select Vestry has decided to revert to a mid-week date this year for the Easter Vestry, and it will be held on Wednesday 30th March at 8pm, possibly the earliest ever date in the parish! This meeting is our 'AGM' when we elect wardens and Select Vestry for the coming year and receive both the Rector's Annual Report and statement of accounts from the Hon. Treasurer.

All those on the Register of Vestrypersons are entitled to vote, and all are entitled to speak.

Confirmation

Confirmation this year will be held in St Mary's Church, Howth on Sunday 10th April at 3pm. This year, we have only a small number of candidates and so have joined our neighbours in Howth for the occasion. The usual services will be held in the parish.

Diocese in Europe

The Rector recently spent a week in Hungary, and preached at the Anglican chaplaincy in Budapest. The chaplain has spiritual responsibility for all Anglicans and members of the Porvoo Communion in a country slightly larger than Ireland. Most of his charge are expatriates although an increasing number of Hungarians beside those married to ex-pats have recently joined the chaplaincy, which is part of the Diocese in Europe of the Church of England. Naturally they are usually fluent English speakers!

The chaplain, Dr Frank Hegedus, is an American Episcopalian priest of Hungarian origins, although not a Hungarian speaker. He told me that his father never spoke his native language at home because he never thought he would ever be able to return home because of Communism. He never did, but died before its collapse.

They have outgrown their chapel in the city centre (the basement of a former merchant's residence) and are experimenting with Sunday worship in various sites: that Sunday was in a theological college chapel high up in the Buda Hills whose grounds provided a spectacular view over the city far below. The guide books promised below freezing temperatures, but the reality was that Spring-like temperatures prevailed, there was no snow whatsoever to be seen even on the highest hills and the Rector was weighed down with winter

clothing! Indeed, many were worried about how hot the coming summer might be, as last year temperatures regularly were into the 40s and many people could not afford air-conditioning. Somehow, Ireland seems to be experiencing wet cold summers as an effect of global warming exacerbated by 'El Nino', and perhaps we should be more thoughtful of the plight of those elsewhere and also not complain so much about our miserable weather!

Many of us travel to the Continent for holidays and a small number of us have holiday homes used by ourselves, families and friends. There is probably a chaplaincy near you, as they are found in most tourist areas, centred around an expatriate population which needs the support of visitors for its financial viability. Do support it: details can be found on the Diocese in Europe website. The diocese covers Europe, Morocco and the former CIS states in Asia (most of whose names end in -stan!). In all of these you will be assured of a warm welcome.

The Lutheran Episcopal Churches of Scandinavia, Finland and the Baltic States are also in full communion with the Anglican Churches, as are the Churches of the Utrecht Communion and the Reformed Episcopal Churches of Spain and Portugal which split from Rome over infallibility about 1870. The latter churches had their first bishops ordained by Church of Ireland bishops after the Church of England turned down their request lest the vehemently Roman Catholic governments of the time be annoyed! Language may be a problem but it is surprising how quickly it can be bridged!

St. Andrew's Recipe

EASY HOT CROSS BUNS

Ingredients:

For the Buns:

- 500g strong white bread flour
- ½ tsp salt
- 2 heaped tsp mixed spice
- 50g caster sugar
- 50g butter – Chopped into small pieces
- 200g mixed dried fruit
- 7g sachet easy-blend dried yeast
- 200ml milk
- 2 eggs

For the Glaze:

- 3 tbsp plain flour
- Honey or Golden Syrup

Method:

1. Put the flour into a bowl and stir in the salt, mixed spice and sugar together
2. Rub in the butter with your fingertips. Stir in the dried fruit, then sprinkle over the yeast and stir in. Gently warm the milk until it is warm enough for you to dip your finger in. Beat together the eggs and pour into the dried ingredients.
3. Using a blunt knife, mix the ingredients to a moist dough, then leave to soak for 5 minutes. Remove from the bowl and cut dough into 8 equal pieces.
4. Shape the dough into buns on a floured surface. Space apart on a baking sheet and cover loosely with cling film. Leave in a warm place until half again in size. This will take between 45mins and 1hr 15mins depending on how warm the room is.
5. When the buns have risen, heat oven to 220C/fan 200C/gas 7. Mix the flour with 2 tbsp water to make a paste. Pour into a plastic food bag and make cut one of the corners so you can pipe out a cross on top of each bun.
6. Bake for 12-15 minutes until risen and golden. Trim the excess cross mixture from the buns, then brush all over with honey or golden syrup. The buns will keep fresh for a day. After that they are best toasted and served with butter.


